Homage to the Christmas Tree

How vividly these words recall the onslaughts of the force of darkness against the School of the Sacred Science in Los Angeles in 1924! But we rose to our feet at the close of each class meeting and chanted this litany together for many weeks and months. And there was an outpouring of power beyond all imagination. No wonder all the efforts of the forces of evil and destruction came to naught! It is wonderful for the individuals of a group to pass through such an experience, and if it comes to you, count it as one of your greatest blessings. Why? Because when you have passed through, you have the asset of courage and strength and power that nothing else can give.

In the sixth chapter of the Gospel of St. John there is this record: "From that time many of his disciples went back and walked no more with him. Then said Jesus unto the twelve, "Will ye also go away?" Simon Peter then answered him, "Lord, to whom shall we go? Thou hast the words of eternal life." Peter even then felt the solidarity of the collective force of the twelve, and that is the spirit expressed in the first line of this litany. "There is no more any parting of the ways." I know that is true with many of you — you have tried with every power you have to break away from this group and go another way, but there is no more any parting of the ways for you, for your spirit has merged with those with whom you are working upward to the Light.
